I traveled to *Jamestown, Rhode Island* on a Catalina 380, *Freebird*, on my way to Newport Harbor. We left

Stonington after a beautiful sunrise with light winds on a warm and humid day. We grabbed a mooring at the Conanicut Marine Services, although our plan was to try to get a mooring at the Jamestown Boat Yard the next night before eventually moving into Newport for the weekend. Jamestown Boat Yard has limited transient facilities, a slip may be available and they recommend calling ahead, restrooms and showers, marine supplies and ice. There are no fuel dock or pumpout facilities available.

Within walking distance of the boat yard are a bakery, ice cream shop, deli, wine and cheese shop and supermarket. Since we ate all our meals on the boat, we didn't try any of the numerous restaurants in town. Most of the restaurants in the area appear to be a block or so west of the harbor.

It was a very foggy night and we could not see the bow of the boat from the cockpit. Next morning we had to wipe down the boat before we could leave for a trip across the bay to Newport for the weekend.

Yard Committee Report From Chairman Roger Wieland

By now I'm sure many of you are working on your boats. A couple of things to remember: secure your ladder, wear eye protection and a mask when scrapping or sanding and be sure to place tarps or plastic under your boat when working on the bottom. Police the area around your boat before you leave for the day. Clean up and unplug your boat before you leave.

> If your boat is blocking another boat you must be ready in April for launching. If you have a problem call me sooner rather than later.

> If your boat is shrink wrapped it is your responsibility to dispose of it...Take it home. Do not put it in the Club's dumpsters.

> We have already started to launch boats. We launch on Saturdays and Wednesday mornings. Please call or email me to set up a date.

Our next event is the Raingutter Regatta on April 30. This year's theme is "The America's Cup." \$5 gets you in the door. Join us for ice cream and prizes. All ages welcome, even adults!

Overview: The Raingutter regatta gets its name from the racecourse competitors sail on...10ft sections of raingutter. Teams of two people, in a round robin match race format, race handmade sailboats. Boats are propelled by the use of a straw being blown in to the sail. Hands are NOT allowed to touch the boats while racing. Teams can compete in the One Design fleet, the Open Fleet (box rule...see below) or BOTH. *Cost:* **\$10** *registration fee* at the door includes pizza and drinks. If you have no interest in putting your own boat kit or Box Rule Boat together, you may charter a boat for an additional \$20.

Race Course: The course is made of a pair of 10ft long rain gutters, on a long table. We then fill the gutters with approximately 4 inches of water. Each team must blow their boat from one end of the gutter to the other while wearing a lifejacket (provided). The winner of each heat is the team that gets their boat back to the start/finish line first.

Fleets: There will be two separate fleets. The "One Design" Fleet, which will be the Raingutter Regatta boat kits. You must use all the pieces of the kit. You may sand the boats but you may not alter the general shape of the hull. The kits will all be THE SAME. If you choose to enter the "One Design" Fleet, you may purchase your kit at an MYC general meeting, one online, or at a Boy Scout Store. Fleet number 2 will be "Box Rule" Fleet. These boats are designed and built by you with whatever materials you choose, as long as you adhere to the "Box Rule."

Box Rule: (the boat will be placed into a box and MUST fit!)

Hull Material: Any

Hull Length: No longer than 7" or shorter than 6" from stem to stern (including the rudder).

Beam Width: more than 4" at its widest point.

Mast Height: No higher than 6.5" from the deck to the top of the mast section.

Keel: Allowed, but not to exceed 2" below the bottom of the hull.

Rudder: allowed but not to exceed 2" below the bottom of the hull.

Sail: Any material but not to exceed 24 square inches. (Ex. 4" x 6" or 3" x 8") Questions? Feel free to email.
