# Report for April from the Board of Directors

From Senior Director Roger Wieland

- ➢ Ed Occhino, representing the Electric Meter Committee, addressed the Executive Committee about their concerns with the electric meters on the docks. Ed explained that we have 146 meters and that this past year we had problems with 12 meters. He was unable to read 7 meters because the lens was cloudy and the other 5 had mechanical problems. Ed and his committee will read the meters more frequently in an effort to uncover problems and resolve them in a timely fashion. The 2009 bills will be sent out within a week.
- There were three companies who were asked to submit a bid on the bulkhead project. Of the two companies who submitted bids, the Board approved Sound Marine, which was lower. We have had good experience with Sound Marine on past projects. We expect the work to start by mid May and take two weeks.
- Rear Commodore Senackerib discussed items for the Long Range Planning Committee to consider. An item of keen interest and debate will be the decision to renovate and expand our clubhouse or to build a new one.

*From Yard Chairman Andy Hudson:* The Yard Committee will have a crew available to launch boats on Saturdays in May, with Sundays scheduled on an as needed basis. We start at 0800 and work until we are done for the day—rain, shine, or snow. Members with deep draft vessels should ensure that there is enough water to launch.

Ask Captain Dick: As early as the 17<sup>th</sup> century it was known that the sun circled the earth every 24 hours and that for every hour the sun moved 15 degrees regardless of latitude. With this in mind, if you have a clock set to the prime meridian (Greenwich, England), and you recorded the time of meridian transit (high point to the sun in the sky) by knowing how many hours and minutes the sun was past the prime meridian you could calculate your longitude in degrees. The problem was back in the early 18<sup>th</sup> century a clock that would keep accurate time at sea was unheard of. An hourglass was the closest thing available until John Harrison, the son of a carpenter, spent a good part of his life inventing the first chronometer. For his efforts, he received a 20,000 pound prize from the British Parliament, and the British now had a way of calculating longitude.
