From MYCLA Captain Deb Fass: Boating season is finally in full swing! It's nice to see everyone enjoying the club again this season.



Safety Items From Chairman John Funk

First Aid Kits

New first aid kits replace the older ones, and are located in the Clubhouse galley, the Snack Shack dining room, and on the center pole in the Pavilion. To open, remove the kit from the mounting hooks and place on a flat surface – this will keep the contents from spilling out, and will make it easier to close. A smaller kit is also located in Gerry's. Eyewash kits are being purchased and will be located with each first aid kit.

Fire Extinguishers

Expired and missing fire extinguishers have been replaced, and are located on each dock in the labeled cabinets, in all buildings, and will be more extensively distributed in the boat storage areas in the fall. Midsize (10 lb.) extinguishers are also at each picnic grill area. Since some may find the larger 20 lb. extinguishers difficult to handle, a midsize extinguisher has also been placed with the larger extinguisher on the middle pole (with the first

Safety Ladders and Ring Buoys

Collapsible safety ladders are bolted on each dock at the slip space between the fingers. Should someone fall overboard these ladders can be quickly lowered into the water to help climbing onto the dock. Red ring buoys with heaving lines attached are hooked to each fire extinguisher cabinet on all docks.

Please familiarize yourself with all these items on your dock and around the club so that you will be better prepared in an emergency. Hopefully you will never have to use any of these items. Address any questions or comments to the Safety Committee. John Funk, Chairman (845-323-6106).


