Procedure to Follow for Slip Changes at MYC

From Mooring Committee Chairman Gurran Kane

- Contact Mooring Committee and provide information regarding the purpose of the slip change:
 e.g. larger boat, preferred location, personal reasons, etc.
- Make your written request with the following information:
 - o the length of the hull
 - overall length of boat including swim platform and bow sprit
 - o beam
 - type of boat (sail/cruiser)
 - o projected date when slip will be needed
 - any other pertinent information
- The Mooring Committee will inform the member when a decision has been reached.

All boats must be berthed in assigned slips.

tion until the June meeting. This will fall under "unfinished business," and we can then continue our discussions.

I have placed in the Clubhouse copies of the report if you care to read this in its entirety. It can also be found posted on MYC's website (www.minisceongoyc.org). Please do not remove the report from the clubhouse so that others may also read it.

The following is the conclusion of the report from John Perkins: **Conclusions**

It is my opinion that repairing the existing building would be cost prohibitive in that the materials that were originally provided may not be readily available or cost effective in providing repairs to the existing building. Any new construction would have to be replaced exactly with similar materials to which may not currently exist in the marketplace. It would be cost prohibitive to renovate the existing plumbing, mechanical systems as well as increase the structural stability by means structural repair of "shoring" up of the new structure. I would offer the suggestion to the membership that construction of a new building could satisfy all of the above listed concerns with a expense that would likely be less than repairing the existing building then ultimately maintaining it over time.

If new construction were the choice of the membership it may also be a possibility that various components could be salvaged from the existing building for use in any new construction to create a more enriched design that embraces the past but pursues the future.

Lastly, the information booth is now up and running. Float plans, electric meter reading forms and social events are some of the things that can be found. Check it out!

The week of May 22 is safe boating week. It is also the start of the boating season. With that in mind I would like to take advantage of this newsletter to do a bit of preaching.

Did you know that boating and its related activities is the most dangerous sport in the United States? More people lose their lives boating than in any other sport. All sports have protective gear, including boating. Last month in Florida two people lost their lives boating in the Vero Beach area. One fell off of the bridge of a 40 ft sport fisher, the other fell out of an 18 ft runabout. Neither was wearing a life jacket, and they both drowned. In addition the 18 ft was equipped with a dead man's switch that would have killed the engine when the operator was thrown from the boat, instead the boat came back around, hit him, and the prop took some gouges out of him. The point is, you can be thrown out of any size boat, and that lanyard for the dead man's switch is a very important piece of safety equipment, but only if you use it. Here's wishing you a safe and happy boating season.

Joe Senackerib wants to know why diesel engines are so much better than gas engines. Actually they are not; diesel fuel manufacturers put an additive in diesel fuel, so that when diesel owners sniff the exhaust, it makes them feel superior to gas engine owners. Fortunately this happens over time, so non diesel owners are not affected. Their only reaction to short term exposure will be to note that something doesn't smell right.

Oyster Bay, Long Island, is a very well protected quiet harbor on the north shore, west of Huntington. There are many places to anchor in protected water, and a nice public beach in the north end of "West Harbor." If you prefer a mooring, there are two excellent choices: Oyster Bay Marine Center www.obmc.com 516.624.2400; and the Sagamore Yacht Club www.sagamoreyc.com 516.922.0555. Their facilities are side by side (Sagamore to the west), on the south shore of the

Bay, a short walk from the village of Oyster Bay with its many shops and restaurants.

Oyster Bay Marine Center is a full service marina, and will allow free dinghy tie up (tips graciously accepted). They also have excellent launch service and repair facilities.

Sagamore Yacht Club has a lovely facility with a restaurant open weekends and Wednesday nights, a beautiful deck overlooking the water and launch service.

Enter the bay going south, follow the markers carefully as you turn west and pass the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club on your right. Follow the channel south to find good anchorage, call the marina/yacht club and pick up a mooring or pass the mooring fields and turn north into West Harbor for more anchoring space. Sit back and relax or hop in the dinghy and explore in these quiet surroundings.
