#### **Cruising Fleet**

#### From Chairman Don Rubin

We had several intrepid boaters who braved the mighty Hudson River for the annual dinghy safari. I don't know what they were doing out there with the nasty weather forecast and choppy river conditions. This month we have a special guest providing the favorite travel location article. Kevin and Dianne Silver took a cruise out to Long Island with friends along for the adventure. The story below could be an inspiration to some of you looking for some great places to visit.

*From Kevin and Dianne Silver:* We just completed our two week cruise to Long Island and Block Island Sounds. I'm delighted to say there were no mishaps save one partial grounding of Silver Lining. We stayed in slips half the time and picked up a morning or anchored the balance of our stays.

Taking full advantage of the ebb current we disembarked from Nyack Boat Club on Monday August 7 at 6:30am. Our

first port was <u>Brewers at</u> <u>Stamford, CT</u>. The following morning was another early start, motoring all day and anchoring in <u>Coecles Harbor in Shelter</u> <u>Island</u>. Shelter Island is nestled between the twin forks of Long Island and, truth be told, we could have spent three to five days exploring all the wonderful harbors just within a 20 mile radius.



We were thrilled when a pod of dolphins joined us for part of the sail!

The entrance to Coecles Harbor is by far one of the narrowest entrances you can imagine with a sharp turn upon entering. You are so close to the folks on the beach you could almost slap their hands. With the Wednesday weather forecast iffy at best, we again departed very early for Block, sailing close hauled for about 20 miles with 15-20' kt. winds and 3-4 ft. seas off the SE.

The <u>Great Salt Pond in Block Island</u> is about a mile wide and the transient home to as many as 1200 boats on any given day. We arrived before noon mid-week and there were no moorings available so we elected to drop anchor. Not an optimal choice as the Pond is very deep making anchoring a challenge. We set anchor in 30ft of water with 175' of line and 25' of chain. Our Bruce anchor kept us secure in the 20+kt winds that kept up for two days. We found the high cost of launches to be a real annoyance. The Block Island Launch is available to all in the Pond at \$4.00 pp, each way. *continued on page three*

If you have not submitted your Winter Storage form, please do so to insure a space for your boat in the Yard. If you need a form you can pick one up in the Club House or get it on the MYC web site. Please mail it to my home: 92 N. Island Avenue, Ramsey, NJ 07446 Or email it to me.

Additionally check your jack stands before your hauling date. Check the wooden tops and replace if broken and lubricate the adjustment handle. It makes it a lot easier for the Yard Committee to set your boat up when we are not dealing with rusted stands that are difficult to adjust. If you are planning to remove your mast please contact me.

The haulout schedule will be posted in the Club House, the Snack Shack and the MYC web site by October 1, 2014.

While anchored at Block look for Aldo's Market travelling from boat to boat in the anchorage selling muffins, shrimp cocktails, calzones and other assorted goodies.

After two days, the winds lessened somewhat and we left early in the morning for Stonington, CT. We weren't alone. The attenuated winds precipitated a parade of boats exiting the harbor. We again sailed close hauled for 14 miles with west winds at 15kts.With the humid weather, we called ahead for a slip at <u>Stonington Harbor Yacht Club</u> (\$3.50/ft.) and plugged in making good use of Silver Lining's A/C. The cost for launch service was even higher than Block at \$5.00 each way. Another good reason to take a slip in hot/humid weather! Stonington YC has excellent facilities and an outstanding dining room.

Departing Stonington, we had light wind sailing in Fishers Island Sound to New London, CT. This is the body of water where the Romano's had their close encounter with a nuclear submarine ;) While trying to determine where Shaw Cove (our destination) was located in New London Harbor, we had an altercation with rocks which scared the hell out of us. We found ourselves in a shallow rocky environment with the boat sitting up on a rock ledge :( Unfurling our Genoa spun the boat around and off the ledge without damage and a collective sigh of relief. We stayed at <u>Crockers Boat Yard</u>. (\$2.75/ft.) and dined at Gaspar's (would recommend), a short walk from the marina.

Sunday we motored in Fog for a while and then took advantage of the light breezes sailing to Old Saybrook. We had reservations at <u>Saybrook</u> <u>Point Inn and Marina</u> (\$3.50/ft.) which has great amenities including courtesy car, laundry facilities, indoor and outdoor pools, dining, nice showers: lovely environment.
