cruising. North Carolina has so much great boating with an enormous variety of landscape and conditions. There are many wide open sounds, rivers with wooded shorelines, barrier islands with fabulous beaches, all connected by manmade canals through the swamp land. The towns we visited are small and quaint, with nice waterfront parks that often include a free town dock. There are quiet anchorages almost everywhere. The marinas we stayed at are varied in style and amenities, but all are full of friendly people—and the price is right. There are endless possibilities for cruising by land or sea to explore North Carolina's waterways.

Although the weather was cold we still enjoyed the scenery as we passed south through Elizabeth, across the wide open Albemarle Sound, down the Alligator and Pungo Rivers to Bel Haven, along the Pamlico River and Sound to Oriental and finally to the coast at Morehead City and Beaufort. That does not even include side trips to New Bern, Edenton or any of the Outer Banks, all of which are ready to be explored. The trip south continues along the coast inside the barrier islands past Southport at the mouth of the Cape Fear River and soon on to Myrtle Beach and South Carolina. When planning to travel, put North Carolina's waterways on the list!
