locks to tackle. These allow you and your boat to be raised or lowered to the next water elevation.... the locks are truly a marvel of human ingenuity and nothing to be feared. However, the first lock you encounter, the Federal Lock, is very grungy and does not supply the hanging ropes that you will find in the remaining 11 locks owned and operated by NY State. The current

can affect the ease with which you secure your hanging lines, but keep in mind that the attendants will help in the NY State locks if something goes amiss. 95% of the time, it was a breeze... each experience built my confidence.

The total experience was something we will remember as a highlight of our boating lives. Director's Report for September, 2017

1. Roger Wieland updated the Board on the activities and concerns of the Yard Committee. Roger's major concern was the travel lift and Roger asked John Kime to attend because he understands the problem with the travel lift.
2. The slate of Officers for 2018 was presented to the Executive Committee. The membership must vote approval.
3. Director Silver presented the recommendations of the bylaw committee. After a short discussion the Commodore suggested that we send the recommendations back to the committee.
4. Director Brienza commented on the new clubhouse location. He stated that the location indicated must be evaluated for underground utilities and that the engineer must approve the site.
5. Director Brienza confirmed that he is investigating the best type of parking permits for trailers.
6. The Board reaffirmed the need to enforce the two new mooring rules previously approved.
7. Commodore Basley advised the Board that the Gooler property has a Health Department notice on the front door. He indicated that we need to keep on top of this situation.
8. The Commodore advised that protocol requires Club Officers in uniform to attend local funerals for members and their immediate family. It is recommended that Board members also attend these funerals.
9. The Commodore questioned why the Social Committee does not have a budget for the Sutherland Regatta since they are now responsible for the food portion. It appears to be an oversight and will be corrected.
10. Director Senackerib expressed concern about two dogs running free at the Annual Picnic. He asked the people to put their dogs on a leash which they did.
11. Director Silver was shown a video conference system that he believed would be of interest to the Board. After a short discussion it was decided not to go any further with the video conference system.
12. Director Silver expressed an opinion that members of the Executive Committee have a responsibility to the membership to try not to take a very active position on contested issues.
13. The Holiday Party Date has been changed to Sunday, December 3.
14. Director Silver advised that NY State, free of charge, will test drinking water for lead.
15. It was suggested that the Plumbing Committee should consider using steel plates to protect the areas with exposed ground plumbing.
16. Penny Bridge would like to use parking lot one for winter boat storage. They would need it from October 1 to May 15. They will pay us \$2,000 per month or a total of \$16,000.
