The US Coast Guard requires a "prolonged blast" defined as 4 to 6 seconds. **Boats entering have the right of way** and should sound their horn when approaching the final turn into the gap. Those exiting should sound their horn and give way as needed.

Cruising Fleet Report

The Dinghy safari is scheduled for **Sunday August 6**; meet at the flag pole at 11AM. It might be a good idea to check your outboard to be sure it will start ... and then keep running.

The adventure continues ... After a pleasant night spent at the Harbor One Marina in Old Saybrook Point we continued east on Long Island Sound. It was our first time traveling to Mystic Connecticut by boat. The sail from Saybrook to the Mystic River was uneventful with a light breeze and calm waters and the current was with us! The fair current presented a small problem. We flew by the buoys marking the entrance to the Mystic River. We were well past it before we noticed the buoys on the chart did not match real life. I'm sure we would have had an easier time

> if our compass was working (this was before the boat had a GPS or chartplotter) Purchasing a new compass moved higher on the "to do" list at our next stop. We slowed to a crawl to figure out where we were. Now we had to beat back against the current and watch out for the shallow rocks seemingly everywhere. Major rocks were marked in the water with a warning sign "ROCKS". Once we found the first

buoy, the rest of the marks fell into place. Dan was in charge of matching up the buoys on the chart with the buoys along the narrow, winding, well-marked channel. We were also able to follow other boats sailing upstream. Then we noticed we had to crank up the motor a little higher or risk an extra hour wait at the next bridge opening. There are two bridges on the Mystic River, a railroad bridge which is usually open except when a train is scheduled and the highway bridge in the middle of town opening only once an hour. We were also anxious to meet up with the rest of the crew that was waiting at the Mystic Seaport. They had driven up by car.

We were either the first boat to the bridge or we had just missed the quarter hour opening. Turns out our timing was almost perfect. The bells went off, the gates went down and the gears slowly opened the bridge. Danny grabbed a couple pictures as we went through the bridge opening. We called the Seaport office and the docking crew was waiting for us at the bulkhead as we slowly motored up looking for our slip assignment.

Our slip was along the bulkhead next to the old shipyard. It was as if we were another exhibit at the seaport. Dan took a quick look around for his mother and sister, but they were nowhere to be found. We thought maybe they had walked into town to watch us go through the bridge. We know we can usually find them at the nearest ice cream shoppe and of course, that's where we found them...

- * Replace the poppets (tops) if broken.
- * Grease or oil them to insure they work easily.

Now is the time to do this Not on your haul out day.

If you are going to remove your mast bring at least two people to assist you and speak to me prior to hauling.

Security Committee

In preparation for the installation of new yard fencing, the security team will be preparing the grounds behind the storage sheds. Special Request:

The current supply of handheld gate remote controllers is insufficient. Newer vehicles have built in transmitters that can be programmed to replace handheld remote gate openers, so please consider returning your device for a deposit refund. Director's Report for July, 2017

* The Board has directed the Treasurer to send the financial report to the heads of each committee and to post it on the member's only section of the MYC web site.

* Director Silver reported that the bylaw committee recommends a change in the bylaws that requires a member to attend four meetings in the previous twelve months to have the right to vote. This will be presented to the membership.

* The Board agreed that the new members being presented tonight for membership should have a prorated adjustment to their slip fee for this year.

* Director Hudson reported on the possible use of credit cards for MYC payment.

* Commodore Basley addressed his concern that the club reduced its income to accommodate additional parking for dock 6 and that people are still parking on the road by dock 6.

* The time capsule was discussed by Commodore Basley. The Auxiliary will pay for the time capsule but we need to have someone to oversee the contents and we need to decide at which event we should conduct the ceremony.

* Vice Commodore Brienza reported that only one person showed up for Marina Day. The Board next year will consider if we should do it again.

* Director Silver reported that we will shortly begin the reconstruction of the drainage pit to meet the SPEDES regulations.

* Director Silver reported that approval of our request for aquatic treatment of the seaweeds in the basin appears to be in trouble.

* There will be a HRBYCA meeting held at MYC on July 25.

* Several of the Directors expressed concern about the lack of or improper use of boat horns when coming or going in and out of the gap. When returning the horn should be sounded when your boat is about a hundred and fifty feet from turning to proceed through the gap. When exiting your horn should be sounded when you are about one hundred feet from going through the gap. The horn should be sounded for a "Prolonged Blast" defined by the Coast Guard as 4-6 seconds. Boats exiting must give way to boats entering the harbor.

* The Board discussed the use of decals for cars, trailers and boats. The trailers must have decals on them but it was felt not necessary for the others.

* There are a number of gate cards still held by people who are no longer members. It was decided that these cards should be deactivated.

* The Board decided that the Treasurer should have a debit card for emergency use.

* The town has informed us that we must eliminate all standing water.
