- A contract document for Striper Fishing boats needs to be created. Director Andy Hudson will follow up on this.
- A review of a new travel lift was made.
- The Gooler Property is still under review and a meeting with the club's attorney has been scheduled.
- An early haul out procedure for Associate Members was established.
- In the club's contract with members, the requirement to have "hull coverage" will be removed from the contract.
- The Executive Committee will research changing our electric billing for in-water boat usage.
- Continuing membership was discussed with the possible need to change the wording in our by-laws. This action will be further explored.
- Summer land storage for repairs will be modeled on a case by case basis.
