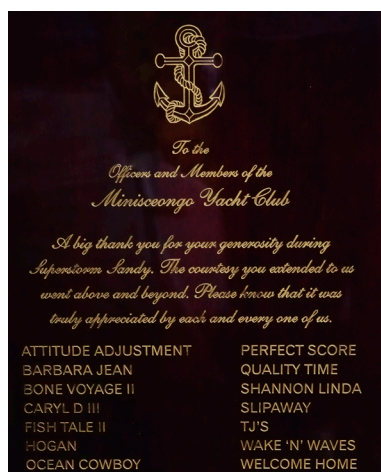

## Report for July from the Board of Directors

*From Director Tony Schweiker*

- ✎ Dennis Doyle of the Finance Committee presented the board members a review of the meeting with Provident Bank representatives regarding a line of credit or business loan to help finance the dredging project and or clubhouse construction.
- ✎ A statement will be added to the MYC contract stating that "MYC reserves the right to examine a member's **proof of insurance** at any time."
- ✎ Rear Commodore Silver updated the Directors on the latest pricing and details of the **dredging project**.
- ✎ **Storm-water runoff plan:** The need to create a runoff plan for storm water and updating of our wash-down area near the launch pit was approved in principal.
- ✎ An increase in the **long-haul rate** was approved for associate members, from \$6.00 per foot to \$10.00 per foot.
- ✎ Rates for **regular members** will be increased—in-water **slip rates** \$16.00 to \$18.00 per foot and on-land **storage rates** from \$13.00 to \$14.00 per foot. This will be in effect for the fall billing for on-land storage.

## Important Reminder

*From Electrical Chairman Frank Lindsell*

- **Electrical cords at the dock must be properly locked in position** to prevent loss of power and electrical fire.
- **All electrical plugs are twist to lock, not just inserted.** If you are unsure how to do this, see your finger captain or Frank!
- **Before removing or inserting the plug, turn off the switch on the pedestal!** This will prevent an electrical arc, which will protect the club's and your equipment.



## Reminders from Harbor

*From Harbor Master John Kime*

- ⌘ All docks and fingers must be kept clear of personal items at all times.
- ⌘ Hoses and electrical cords must be hung from the pedestals hangers.
- ⌘ Do not attach anything to dock, fingers or pilings other than by using provided cleats.
- ⌘ If a dry-sail boat needs a slip for a night or a friend needs a transient slip, please call Harbor Master John Kime at [see hard copy].
- ⌘ If there is something you need changed or help with, or if you have any Harbor questions, please contact Harbor Chairman John Kime at [see hard copy].
