Dreaming of St. Croix

I think this month we will travel to an exotic destination I haven't visited in several years. I was fortunate to spend two summers at the marine science school located on Teague Bay on the eastern end of St. Croix. Hurricane Hugo damaged the school and the island on September 17, 1989 and the school was never rebuilt.

Teague Bay is the location of the prestigious St. Croix Yacht club. The OUTRIGGER Bar was a jab at the Yacht Club. It offered membership in a "Yacht Club" for \$5.00. This included a t-shirt and membership card, live music at the bar every weekend. The entrance to Teague Bay is a channel through the barrier reef which requires careful navigation in the morning hours. The sun will be in your eyes. There is 7-10 feet of water with a sandy bottom. Once inside the bay there is plenty of room to anchor, moorings are generally privately owned. The Yacht club has a dinghy dock and showers. A race on friends' 45 foot sailboat on July 4th was a great day on the water. Running backstays that needed to be adjusted on each tack added a bit of excitement for a novice sailor. The old wood boat was home to a research team from the Smithsonian. I'm not sure what their PHRF was but the boat spread a lot of sail.

northeast of Christiansted Harbor. I don't recall the distance form Teague Bay but I believe it is shorter. The Park was a prime destination for many class snorkeling trips or shallow scuba dives. Some of the hotels run trimaran day trips for snorkeling, rum punch included. I was fortunate to go by sailboat several times and dive boats many other times for snorkeling and diving.

There is an anchorage off the sandy beach on the west end of Buck Island in 10-15 feet of water. Off the east end of the island, day moorings can be picked up for use while you snorkel the well marked underwater trail. There are plaques along the trail that show some of the major underwater sights including the different coral types. Since the island is a nesting site for several species of sea turtles, the island is off-limits from June to December.

One of my best memories of my time at school on St.Croix; Cruzan Rum cost \$2.00 for a fifth, a can of coke cost \$1.00!

Cleating Method From Lou Petrosino

Captain Jack Sweeney of Golden Isle Marina, St. Simons Isle, GA, taught me the use of mooring lines that allows full control without leaving the boat.

In the illustration the eye is a minimum of 12". Better flexibility would be had with an 18" eye. Hook the horn of the cleat in the direction the strain will be taken and wrap the cleat as shown. This will lock the line to the cleat and prevent it from slipping off.

When coming in unassisted, bow first into a dock, the order of attaching lines would be: Aft spring line, Bow line, Forward Spring line, Stern line, with appropriate maneuvers of the boat. I'll let you work out the order for docking stern first (Hint: generally you will have to get the boat at an angle to the dock to reach out and cleat the bow line).

An added benefit to this method is the removal of tripping points due to excess line on the dock.
