Message from Commodore Gutierrez

The circulators did their job, and we were able to return to Phase I in about a week.

We've had some issues with the heating system at the Clubhouse. Harry Moser and I found the Clubhouse to be 31 degrees one morning. The repair was made before any damage to the plumbing occurred. Once again, I'd like to remind everyone of the "If you see something, say something" policy. The information is only useful if it gets out. This will require the club to come together and help to shore up our cherished basin.

Cruising Fleet News

From Chairman Dick Myers: With spring just around the corner, it's getting closer to the time when we break out the soap and polish to start the process of getting our boats ready for another year at MYC. Speaking of another year, the date for the spring Cruising Fleet meeting will be June 5. Once again a free dinner will be served; I'm thinking Bonnie's chicken gumbo and wine over a bed of linguine. More on this later. On the agenda will be the date and theme for the annual Dock-Go-Round, Dinghy Safari, and any possible summer cruises.

Ask Captain Dick: Did you ever wonder how all those ships from England, France, Spain, etc., crossed the ocean and made it over to our shore before GPS, Loran, accurate watches or any of the navigation tools that we have? One of the major navigation tools besides a compass available to 18th and 19th century navigators was a sextant. By measuring the angle the North Star (Polaris) is off the horizon, you can tell what your

present latitude is. Since Polaris is virtually at a standstill above the North Pole, at the North Pole you would measure the angle to be 90 degrees or directly above your head. At the equator, the angle would be 0 degrees. The latitude in the northern hemisphere starts at 0 degrees at the equator and ends at 90 degrees at the North Pole. So if you were to leave Spain and keep Polaris at 40 degrees to your North, you would sail a straight line to the southern tip of Long Island. This would be the entrance of New York Harbor following 40 degrees of latitude.

John Rodway wants to know how a sailboat can sail into the wind. Actually they can't. My own personal opinion is that it's a conspiracy among sailors to make us power boaters jealous of the fact they are getting a free ride from the wind while we power boaters have to pay for it. I think that they just run their motors and pretend they are sailing.
