### DSC/VHF radio, GPS and MMSI

Your VHF radio equipped with *Digital Selective Calling (DSC)* is the single most important piece of safety equipment you can have on board your vessel.

DSC allows the radio to transfer information digitally, not just by voice, and to instantly send a digital distress alert to the Coast Guard. Part of that alert is a nine-digit *Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI)* **number** that identifies your boat. The MMSI number is a bit like a phone number for your boat. Without an MMSI, the digital functions on a DSC-equipped VHF radio will not function. The MMSI number must be registered in a database (Available for free through BoatUS or SeaTow) that is relayed to the Coast Guard for use in Search and Rescue and the **new Rescue 21 system**.

DSC-equipped radios also need to be *interfaced* with a GPS when they are installed so that your position will be sent with the emergency message in a distress situation. You might be tempted to skip this step. Don't! According to the Coast Guard, even though all VHFs sold in the U.S. are required by law to have DSC functionality, 90 percent of the boats with GPS and VHF units onboard don't have them properly interfaced – even though DSC (which gives the Coast Guard your exact location, identity, and boat information automatically, if you make a mayday call), is one of the best and most cost-effective safety features available today.

Getting your GPS and VHF to communicate is a lot easier than most people think. The units talk via an NMEA data stream (NMEA 0183 and/or NMEA 2000) that requires just two wiring connections: an NMEA data in/out, and a ground. Unfortunately there's no standard color coding for these wires, so you'll have to refer to your owner's manuals to find out which wire is which. Once you've done so, connect the GPS data-out wires with the VHF data-in wires, by crimping on butt connectors.

#### Interesting Tidbit

This week, while reading the latest Passagemaker Magazine, I came across Carolyn Shearlock's "Tip of the Month" (July/August p. 92). She states that you can protect your small electronics from lightning by simply putting them in your microwave or regular oven. Both act as a "Faraday Cage" that safely conducts the electricity around the outside of the cage, protecting anything inside.

Clearly you can't protect your hard-wired main electronics, but you can protect handheld VHF, GPS, cell phone, tablet, e-reader, camera, card readers/data cards and even a laptop.

Just don't forget to remove them before cooking!
