It's best to check your boat periodically during the winter, to make sure the stands are tight. They tend to sink and loosen with the freeze/thaw and rain/snow cycles. Plywood should be under the stands to help with this problem. Please don't tie your covers to the stands. If the stands loosen, the wind can use your tarp to pull the stand from under the boat.

Have a great winter, and we'll see you in the spring. *Think ice!* (DN4940) [DN4940 is Andy's ice boat. Ed.]

Sail Fleet News

From Chairman St. John Forbes: The Sutherland Regatta was held on September 25 and 26 this year. The weather was perfect with winds in excess of 10 knots on both days. A total of 30 boats registered. This year, as in previous years, the Sutherland Regatta attracted more boats than any other regatta in the Hudson River Yacht Racing Association (HRYRA) series of regattas. The results of the Sutherland Regatta are given on the MYC website. The associated social functions were also very well supported keeping the ground staff busy cooking breakfasts, serving snacks and chili, and preparing and serving the steak dinner. Hats off to all the volunteers who assisted with the meals over the two days and Race Marshal Kevin Silver and his assistants for conducting three well-run races. MYC was commended by commodores of three yacht clubs for the organization of both racing and social events of the Sutherland Regatta.

Despite having one of the smallest numbers of active racing sailors competing in the HRYRA regattas, the MYC sailors had an outstanding record this year. Jean Nonenmacher took 1st place in the spinnaker division and Jessie Fitzgerald 2nd in the non-spinnaker division in the Women's Regatta in June. In the Shattemuc Regatta on September 11–12 the MYC sailors Jessie Fitzgerald, Joe Paccione and Wayne Mitts took a clean sweep of the C division and Dick Bracken was 1st in A division. In the Sutherland Regatta John Nonenmacher was 1st in A division and Jessie Fitzgerald and Bert Rechtschaffer were 1st and 3rd respectively in C division. In Nyack Boat Club's last Chance Regatta Jessie Fitzgerald and St. John Forbes were 1st and 2nd respectively in C division and Dick Bracken 2nd in A Division. In the Laser regattas at MYC and at Nyack, Andy Hudson was placed in the top three in each of the regattas. In the Hudson Bay Wednesday night races MYC sailors were again in line for trophies with John Nonenmacher 1st in A Division, Jessie Fitzgerald 3rd in B division, Joe Paccione 2nd and Bert Rechtschaffer 3rd in C1 and Bob Tamagny 1st in C2 divisions. Congratulations for fantastic performances by all of the MYC sailors and their crews that assisted them.

Ask Captain Dick: A tumble home is an upside-down hull on a boat. In other words the boat is wider at the water line than at the top of the hull. Some of the Navy's newest destroyers have a tumble home hull design. This will, along with angular design, make it very hard to see on radar. Some old wooden ships of the line were tumble home design, this was done to allow more rows of cannon and to minimize hull exposure at the front and rear from the cannon shots from other ships.

Debra Fass wants to know what a tell-tale is. Like everything else nautical, we boaters have a different name for everything. A bathroom is called a head; the kitchen becomes the galley, etc. A tell-tale is just another name for a tattle-tale, so if you mess up at something there will always be a tell-tale around to rat you out.
