Cruising Fleet From Chairman Don Rubin

Looks like the boating on Hudson season is really over. The last boat in the harbor was taken out on a trailer, the gap closer is in the gap and a bunch of guys put the deicing circulators on the docks ready to be installed. Hope you all had a great time at the Change of Watch last weekend. The food was great and the band did an excellent job. I am proud and honored to have received my second Mud Hook award. I out did myself this time! If you haven't pushed yourself to the limit of common sense, you will never receive this prestigious award.

Several members have mentioned the possibility of a nautical flea market in the spring. I'm sure most of you have some things that you would like to get out of the house. Most likely we will schedule it for March or April. Start getting your "extra boat parts" together.

This month's boating adventure takes us to *Lake George*. According to my research, there are 170 islands on Lake George; you can rent a campsite on

44 of them. We met a cruiser buddy at Bolton's Landing and sailed out to his campsite. His site had a dock to tie up, a porta-john, picnic table, grill, fire-ring and platform to setup a tent. We used his platform to setup a playpen for his young daughter. A reservation is required for day use or for overnight camping. There are three main groups of islands available for camping on Lake George, Long Island Group, Glen Island Group and Narrow Island Group. The Lake George police stopped by at the campsite to do a discharge test on his boat.

Lake George is a strict "no discharge" waterbody. A dye tablet was put into his head and bilge. If they see orange in the water there is a substantial fine. Regular boaters on the lake are very careful not to allow any discharge.

We spent the afternoon touring amongst the islands with some time getting dragged around behind the boat on a tube. Yep, that was a lot of fun. At least the kids seemed to like it! Back at the dock, we lit a fire and grilled some burgers and dogs. Of course some adult beverages tasted pretty good after a hot day on the water.



Lake George in Winter - Almost Frozen

My previous sailing adventure at Lake George was on my 12-foot Wildflower. This sloop-rigged boat was manufactured by the folks that brought you the KOOL foam sailboat, although this boat was much beamier and stable. I was staying at a small motel in Diamond Point that had a small dock. It was one of my first days using the boat and I was new to the sport. The wind was howling, maybe 15 knots, blowing off the shore. It was easy getting off the dock out into the lake but even then the wind seemed kind of strong for this size boat. My friend

strongly suggested that we had been out long enough and that perhaps our lives were in danger. After I turned the boat to head back, it seemed like the wind had significantly increased. It seemed like a good time to take the jib down. I think the boat was really designed to be sailed flat but the boat didn't seem to cooperate! Somehow I was able to get control of the boat and get us safely back to the dock. I had to buy an expensive dinner to make up for the near disaster/near death experience.

After a good night's sleep, we woke to a bright sunny day, per-

fect for another day on the water. So we loaded up the boat with sandwiches, chips and drinks and decided to give it another shot. Once again we were easily able to sail off the dock and putter around for a while. But wouldn't vou know it, it was still pretty windy out on the lake. Darn! Some people are slow to learn. The conditions on the lake were exactly like the day before. It was too windy and too rough for

the intrepid little boat and its crew. But this time I knew how to get out of this situation and it only cost me another way too expensive dinner.

Darn, I didn't see this caution in the list. "Remember to be prepared for sudden weather changes." The shape of Lake George, 32 miles long and 3 miles wide at its breadth, makes it oblong and narrow and ripe for furious winds.
