Report for July from the Board of Directors

From Director Tony Schweiker

- The Directors discussed the question of fees charged for Jet Skis being used as boat tender while kept in members' slips. The Directors reiterated that Jet Skis must be treated as a "dry sail" vessel and therefore subject to a \$10.00 per night rate if kept in any slip overnight. This is in addition to the normal dry-sail rate applied to Jet Skis.
- The Directors affirmed the Club's policy of not allowing pets in the Pavilion during club sanctioned events. This policy has been in effect since 2011.
- Dredging: The Executive Committee has decided that the best alternative for MYC is to have the spoils removed from the premises as soon as reasonably possible during the dredging process.
- A rate of \$.75 per foot per day will be charged for salvaged boats stored on land in the MYC grounds. The same fee applies for members' boats that have transferred ownership to any third party.
- Penny Bridge boat owners wish to show their appreciation of MYC's efforts during Hurricane Sandy by hosting a party at the MYC Pavilion for MYC members...all will be invited.
- The Board of Directors stated again that members are responsible for the actions of their personal contractor when on MYC premises. Commercial vendors *must* show proof of liability insurance before conducting business on the site.

Ask Cptn. Dick

From Captain Dick Myers: As they say, "All good things must end—or in some cases, bad things." After eight years of writing *Ask Captn Dick*, I find myself scratching at the bottom of the barrel for questions. If I come up with or receive a good question, I will respond; but for now thank you for a good run, and thanks to all of you who helped with the questions and answers over the years.

The answer to two-months' ago question is a little bit late. Hopefully, all of you successfully launched your boats without problems. There are two things often overlooked at spring launch on trailered boats with outboards. Remember to:

- Remove the outboard motor cover and check for both water and fuel leaks. Whenever inboards are launched, usually the captain will pull the hatch cover to check for coolant leaks and gas fumes. On an outboard, you can usually see water or gas leaking from the bottom cover. A small fuel leak can go undetected.
- 2) Another thing to watch out for on raw-water cooled engines – both IOs and outboards – if there is a hose connection for fresh water when you flush the engine on land, be sure not to run the engine. The fresh water flush is always connected after the water pump. By running the engine, you are not supplying water to the water pump, and the water pump will burn up. If you want to run the engine, use the ears that cover the raw water inlet.

Preparing for a Cruise

Make a list of things to do at home to prepare for your departure—the one we have forgotten is **turn off the coffee maker**! Here are a few reminders and suggestions:

- Get paper charts and guide books
- Make reservations at the marinas where you plan to stay
- Prepare the boat check all systems, oil, water tanks, fuel, safety equipment etc.
- Pre-freeze bottles of drinking water to chill the cooler, then drink when they melt
- Pre-freeze cooked meals-they will also help

keep the cooler/fridge cold and keep you out of the galley, outside watching the sunset together

- Plan for bad weather that includes extra clothes, indoor games and entertainment
- Plan for good weather—water toys, swim gear, sunscreen, sun glasses and picnic things
- Electronics—camera, music, phones/iPads *and their accessories and chargers*
- Personal medications, first aid kit, *written list of medications/medical history* and doctors' names and phone numbers
- If you will be out of your own area, call your credit card company to report where you will be
- Stock up on your "must haves" (your favorite cereal, coffee, toilet paper, etc.)
- Stash of small bills for tips
- Plenty of quarters for laundry machines
- At least two flyswatters
- *Float Plan to John Kime*—always let people know where you will be and when to expect you back
- *Read electrical meter* before you go, and when you get back send to Ed Occhino
- Relax and enjoy the trip—if the weather is bad, be flexible, change plans, wait it out.
