Cruising Fleet

From Chairman Don Rubin:

The cruising fleet fall meeting is scheduled for October 17. It will feature a pasta dinner at no cost to members. All we ask is that you bring an appetizer or dessert and drinks.

Travel Destination: Port Jefferson is a well-protected, deep-water harbor on Long Island Sound. The harbor is about 2 miles long and has many moorings, good holding if you anchor out, and facilities for visiting boaters. The mean tidal range is approximately 7.5 feet. There are two well-protected anchorages after you pass through the entrance to the harbor, though these may be crowded on a nice weekend.

My favorite place to stay is a mooring at the Setauket Yacht club. The club launch will pick you up from your mooring after hailing on channel 68. There is a clubhouse with nice restrooms and showers. Ice is available from the dockmaster. The club is within easy walking distance of the town and many very nice restaurants, boutiques and shops. Just around the corner is the Bridgeport Ct. to Port Jefferson ferry terminal; service starts around 6 am and ends around 10 pm each day.

Danfords, nearby on the harbor on Bayles dock is a luxury Inn with a fancy restaurant and bar. The marina has moorings and slips available. Fuel and a pump out are available. The Town of Port Jefferson also has slips and moorings with launch service available.

One of my favorite restaurants in Port Jefferson is the Steamroom, across from the ferry dock. This open-air restaurant is known for its seafood; my favorite is the seafood bisque (or New England clam chowder) in a bread bowl!

Further up the street is ZPITA for a Mediterranean type meal. Of course, if you need dessert there are several ice cream parlors within easy walking distance to the harbor. Come to Port Jefferson and Enjoy!

If you have not submitted your Winter Storage form, please do so to insure a space for your boat in the Yard. If you need a form you can pick one up in the Club House or get it on the MYC web site. Please mail it to my home: 92 N. Island Avenue, Ramsey, NJ 07446 or email it to me.

Additionally check your jack stands before your hauling date. Check the wooden tops and replace if broken and lubricate the adjustment handle. It makes it a lot easier for the Yard Committee to set your boat up when we are not dealing with rusted stands that are difficult to adjust.

If you are planning to remove your mast please contact me.

The haulout schedule will be posted in the Club House, the Snack Shack and the MYC web site by October 1, 2015.
