The ramp project is complete and it looks great. The final section was poured on April 14 and after a few days to cure, Jeff Conklin finished the stone and gravel work. Walter (Moe) Moser fabricated railings for the walkway along the Travel Lift pit and our members made short work of installing them. The final touches were made to shore up the platform at the top of the small dock ramp and it's now ready for use. The wall along finger 4 was capped by Jeff Conklin and the roadway was finished on both ends. I want to thank John Kime for heading up this project and all the members who helped get it done. Great job all around.

On work weekend we had a good turn-out and accomplished pretty much all we needed to and more. Saturday weather-wise didn't really cooperate but nevertheless was not a deterrent to the work crews; Sunday was a home-run. Chris Vicidomini and his grounds crew cleaned out the shrub and flower beds, cut and removed the necessary brush and trees and raked up the area. Ed Gutierrez, with

his trusty Kubota tractor, helped spread out the mulch and worked on special landscaping and repair projects. After the grounds were in good shape, his crew helped extend the curbing on the finger 4 roadway adjacent to the new ramp. The Yard crew launched quite a few boats during the weekend and cleaned up ≥ block and other Yard areas. Harry Moser completed the Hot-Box connections and finished the project. Frank Covino's "bright idea" was

having his Electrical crew spend their time up-in-the-air installing the new LED lighting fixtures all around the Club. After driving through that Sunday night I have to say, "Frank you are pretty smart".

Over at Jerry's, Joe Carpenter had the guy's busy keeping equipment running and getting a few projects done. Moe and Skip completed the steel storage rack in the east annex, Frank Brown and Associate Shaun Foran framed in the new lift area and Yogi with the rest of the crew were fixing everything else. They even had time to grease the Travel Lift. Associate Keith Yodice framed out the cooking area south end of the Picnic Pavilion, fabricated and installed working window panels and enclosed the west section of the wall. The Harbor committee worked on the usual dock preparation stuff and began installation work on a new Opti dock system at the location of the old launch ramp.
