From Commodore Art Basley:

On February 2, 1887 a Groundhog, more commonly known as the woodchuck, was used as a meteorologist to predict the weather. This first time event occurred at a place called Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania and forecasted that when a groundhog sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of wintry weather otherwise an early spring would come.

The annual celebration in many places across America was brought over by early German settlers who used hedgehogs to predict the weather. Groundhogs hibernate during the winter months only to come out briefly in early February to find

a mate. Well I'm not sure how they became meteorologists based on this activity but I hope they do not see their shadow this month. Fortunately, we sailors and boaters do not hibernate that much and being optimistic, should get ready for an early launch. Until then check your boat stands and covers as winter weather does have a habit of effecting both.

We have made good progress on the Finger 4 bulkhead and ramp project. Under John Kime's leadership the project is on track to be completed in time for an **early spring**. If you have been following the work so far you can see that a great deal of the area has been excavated, most of the debris removed and the future ramp area in the process of being stabilized by Jeff Conklin. Two (2) of the concrete sections that will be used as the ramp surface have been poured and are ready for setting. Bob Tamagny and Dave Tonneson are keeping things

- * The Commodore wants each committee head to file an annual report on their accomplishments for the year. This was done in the past but has not been done in recent years.
- * The Board decided that our line of credit with the bank should remain open, however the amount currently owed will be reduced from \$21,000 to \$5,000.

Director's Report for December 2016

From Senior Director Joe Senackerib

- * For any long term boat storage, evidence of insurance will be required.
- * There was a brief discussion on the new launch ramp and bulk head. The major points were that we will not have to move the high voltage power line, that only one side of the ramp will have the stones and the wood wall between the pit and ramp area will not need reinforcement.
- * The Board, in order to better control yard storage and mooring, has established the following policies:
 - *Regular members must inform the Membership Committee by October 1st if they do not intend to launch their vessel for the coming season. It is understood that if a regular member wishes to "hold their slip" they must pay their regular slip fee. *Regular members not using their assigned slip for two consecutive years while their vessel remains stored in the yard will lose their previous slip assignment. When ready to return their vessel to the water they will be given priority for a slip assignment.
- * The sea weeds behind several of the docks are still of concern. Director Silver will make a presentation at the General meeting on possible control methods.
- * The Commodore presented a list of the Dock Captains responsibilities.
- * The Commodore presented an updated list of projects and the budgeted amount for each project.

- * The Commodore presented a 5 year plan for review and revision as required.
- * An audit committee will review our books.
- * The Executive committee decided that donations of any kind offered to MYC must have the approval of the Board.
- * All future contracts relating to boats must contain insurance information.
- * The Board decided that anyone not paying their invoices within the required 30 day period, will be required to appear before the Board to explain why they could not pay on time.
- * The Board also reserves the right to not invite an associate back to MYC if they are late on payments a second time.
- * The Commodore presented a list of the social functions at MYC and suggested the Social Committee be responsible for all social functions. The two additional functions would be the Holiday Party and the Change Of Watch. No decision has yet been made.
- * The Commodore was concerned about people who take trips with their boats and do not file a float plan. Float plans can be emailed to the Dock Master, John Kime, or can be placed on the box by the pump out dock.
- * The Board is considering placing another ad in "Boating on the Hudson".
