This month's *travel destination is Newport, R.I.* This year, the Yachting Center was the site of the annual Newport Sailboat/Power Boat show held each year in the middle of September.

Over the years I've developed a routine, the day starts early to avoid the heavy traffic crossing the TZ Bridge. I've got several stops along the way; first stop, just as the store opens, is Defender marine supplies. There are always some equipment or supplies that are needed. Next stop, Mystic for the Marine Consignment shop around the corner from Mystic Seaport. You never know what you will find there, and everything is negotiable. In the past I've found a 50-amp to 30-amp adapter, excellent stainless bow cleat, and a human powered horn to sound when entering or leaving the gap. After a tuna hero at my favorite grinder shop, it is on to Newport.

The excitement builds when crossing the Jamestown Verrazano Bridge and then the Pell Bridge to Newport. The view of Newport Harbor from the bridge is simply amazing. I think a couple of the old America's Cup boats were taking passengers out for a day sail, which is actually a race.

are also boaters there to check out the latest yachts and yachting equipment. After buying an admission ticket, you receive a bag to collect all the brochures that you need to study when you return home. My first task is to find the table with free magazines supplied by the show sponsors including *Cruising World*, *Yachting*, *Multihull sailing*, *Passage Maker*, *Dockwalker*, and also some local guide books. Near the front of the tent is the booth run by Bob Bitch'n (formerly editor of *Lats and Atts* magazine, currently *Cruising Outpost* magazine), the ex-biker turned sailing, world traveler.

Then there is a quick run through the tents. Depending on what equipment you are into at the moment, electronics, engines, power plants, watermakers, air conditioners, maintenance supplies, foul weather gear or sailing hardware. My favorite for sailing hardware is Garhauer, top quality gear at the best prices, with an almost lifetime guarantee.

The Newport show is both power and sail boats. It seems that the boats keep getting bigger and more expensive, and this is a great opportunity to step aboard boats you will not own in this lifetime. I like checking out some of the large trawlers. We have a couple representative models at the MYC, but some at the show have taken a step further with custom or semi-custom designs. Marble countertops, radiant heat stove tops, full size stainless refrigerators, cavernous engine rooms, and full laundry rooms.

I was a little disappointed by the turnout of the sailboat manufacturers. Some brands were represented by only one or two models, some were absent completely. A couple dealers stated that in this economy, they couldn't afford to keep many boats in stock, it was just too expensive. Several of my favorite dealers did not make it to the show.

It turns out the show was pretty good this year, I didn't spend much money and came away with a short wish list. Next time I hope to visit Newport by water!
