From Chairman Don Rubin:

It seems like we took our boats out a little too early this year. The weather has been great! Looks like Christmas will be a nice fall weather day.

The preliminary dates for the winter cruise are March 18,19, and 20, 2016. We are still checking out lodging in Philadelphia and Cape May. We will get back to you when we have more information.

We have packed our bags and headed for our annual trip to Florida. What would the holiday season be without a couple weeks on Sanibel Island on the west coast of Florida. "The Shelling Capital of the Western World", was the reason I went to Sanibel for the first time about 35 years ago. A friend from college sent me the postcard with pictures of dozens of different shells that can be found on the sandy gulf beaches. If you aren't selective about the shells you pick up to bring home, it's possible to bring home shopping bags of shells.

On the southern end of Sanibel Island you can find the Sanibel Marina. The marina can be reached from the south without going under the newly rebuilt (2007) causeway bridges. The recently dredged inlet which cuts between two condo communities on the shore (watch for buoy R "2") should have at least 6-7 feet of water with more at the docks. We've taken our kayak into the canals that wind around behind some pretty nice homes. We've also paddled alongside dolphins in the canals. The marina offers transient slips to 70 feet; reservations are recommended. Slips have water and electric hookups to 50 amps, gas and diesel, repair facility for engine work and electronics and fiberglass, limited groceries; beer, wine and snacks, bait and ice and a ships store. Restrooms, showers, laundry facilities and WIFI are provided. The marina has a fine restaurant, Grandma Dot's,


We haven't found all the shells pictured on that postcard from thirty-five years ago, but we keep on looking.
