Check the wooden tops and replace if broken and lubricate the adjustment handle. It makes it a lot easier for the Yard Committee to set your boat up when we are not dealing with rusted stands that are difficult to adjust.

Special Thanks for Saving the Day

We were out sailing in great conditions Wednesday on the Cape Dory Sea More. Winds ranged from 10-18 knots as we went up to the Bear Mountain bridge and back - great day. The weather forecast was calling for about the same conditions on Thursday so Deb Maidman and I ventured out on the bay. Winds ranged from 8 -14 knots with cool temperatures - a 'Ten' Day.

After 4 hours, we noticed the training edge of the jib seam had a 5 inch opening. At that point, we decided to furl the jib and head back in. We started the engine, pointed the boat into the wind and rolled up the sail. After a few minutes, the very dependable Yanmar diesel stopped cold. I attempted to start the engine again. It started, but once in gear it immediately stalled. I also noticed I could only move the rudder about 10 degrees. Trying to keep calm Deb and I realized something was caught up in the prop and rudder.

We could only sail in a circle due to the jammed rudder and happened to be about 300 years from the MYC channel.

Unfortunately, we were also in the river channel and this made us both very uncomfortable. After calling many people we called Sea Tow who told us it would take 40 minutes to get to our boat as we were number 2 in line for a tow.

At this point my blood pressure was raising or at

least it seemed that way. I felt going in the water with the wind and current would be too dangerous.

We happened to see a boater about 75 yards off our bow and waved for assistance. Initially the boater, **Jay McEwan**, waved back as he thought we were being neighborly. Shortly thereafter he motored over to our boat and we asked for a tow which he immediately agreed to. I can't tell you how good it was to know we were not going to be facing down a 300-foot tanker being stuck in the channel.

Jay mentioned to us that one of our bow lines was off the boat. It was my spring line and evidently wrapped around the prop and rudder. I am generally very careful about lines but since we were tacking it must have come loose and ended up in the water.

As Jay brought us into the marina we were again challenged getting the boat into the slip. With some maneuvering and help from Bill Gooley and Rich, we could secure *Sea More* in our slip.

I again thanked all the people that assisted knowing that at MYC people are always willing to help. Thanks everyone.

Director's Report for August, 2017

From Senior Director Joe Senackerib

- Chris Vicidomini Chairman of the Grounds Committee addressed the Board on the accomplishments for this year and the future plans for Grounds.
- The Board was also addressed by Bill Pigott Chairman of the House Committee. He discussed the overall operation of the house committee and personnel needs.
- Director Tamagny gave an update on the Membership Committee.
- The Board decided that all Associate Members will be invited back for the 2018 season.
- The Board reaffirmed the regulation that if a member does not launch their boat for two consecutive years they no longer have an assigned slip. When ready to launch they will be given priority for a slip.
- The Board decided that for trailered boats two decals will be required. One will be for summer storage and use of the launching ramp. The other will be for winter storage if they store their boat in our yard.
- Director Silver expressed concern that we have not completed work on the runoff pit. This work was to have been completed by now.
- It was recommended in April that we get new travel lift straps. The Board will discuss with the Commodore when he is available.
- Director Silver reported that our request to treat the sea weed in the basin chemically has been turned down.
- The Board expressed a strong opinion that whatever decision will be made now about the location of the new clubhouse should be the final decision.
- Director Tamagny expressed concern that the rule requiring a person to remove a boat purchased from a member within two weeks has not been enforced.
- The Board has decided not to increase the rates for the 2018 boating season even though our property taxes and other expenses have increased.
- The Stony Point Ambulance Corps has requested a donation for an information sign they intend to place on 9W. MYC will donate \$250.00 to the Ambulance Corps.
- The gas problem at the pavilion is partly corrected now and the gas should be fully operative before the Annual Picnic.
- The Board has been informed that several people have used house plugs on the dock pedestals. The pedestal house plugs are for working on the docks and it is against club rules for anyone to use them for any other purpose.
