Report for June from the Board of Directors

From Senior Director Roger Wieland

- Commodore Gutierrez reported that Sound Marine will be delayed starting the work on the Dock 5 bulkhead because of work on an emergency shoring project in Yonkers, NY. Work on our project should start in two weeks.
- The Commodore requested that the no parking rule on the east and west peninsulas be enforced.
- Vice Commodore Tamagny discussed several projects that have not been completed. After discussing each project, plans are being put into place to complete them.
- Past Commodore Gurran Kane has completed 25 years as a working Regular Member. He has therefore been elevated to the position of Life Member by the Board.
- Probationary members, Wayne Mitts and Joe Paccione were approved by the Board for advancement to Regular membership. Cruising Fleet News

From Chairman Dick Myers: The Cruising Fleet held its first meeting on Saturday, June 5, while enjoying a chicken dinner. The Dock-Go-Round was decided to be held the same day as Dancing Under the Stars on June 26.

The next Cruising Fleet function will be held on Saturday, July 24. Since MYC will be shut down for the annual maintenance of the piling supports, and all of the boats will have to find other berths for the day, we figured that it would be a good time to hold our **Annual Raft-up** at Croton. So come on over and join in on the fun. In case the maintenance takes a little longer than anticipated, there will be a few boats spending the night; and all of you newcomers to the club are invited to spend the evening with us.

Another date to keep in mind is August 14. This is the day of our **Annual Dinghy Safari**. We thought that it would be a good idea to tie that date in with the annual gap maintenance closing. I'll have more on that next month.

Ask Captain Dick: Wow, what a stinky question last month. One of the biggest problems with the smelly head is the chemical that was used to treat the waste years ago was formaldehyde. If you started to notice an order, one added more treat-

ment. This actually pickled the effluent, and made it inert. This is just fine for overboard dumping in open water, but not so good for treatment in a waste treatment plant. Formaldehyde is no longer legal for holding tank use, instead enzymes are used. Enzymes are proteins that catalyze or increase the rate of chemical reaction. There are many different enzymes but the ones used in our holding tanks are specially formulated to eat "stuff." One of the problems with enzymes is that they are affected by heat and become inactive on very hot days.

Now you know why, but what to do? Assuming that all hoses are odor proof and the vent line is clear and sealed to the outside, your best bet is to not use the head on the boat. Other than that, pump out often; use lots of enzymes and try adding a bit more every time you use the head—especially for the stinky stuff.

Bob Weismantel wants to know where he can get some baggy wrinkles. It seems that he's embarking on a long cruise and left his supply at home. I don't know, Bob, maybe the nearest Shop Rite.

Oh, by the way, the club doesn't really shut down for a pile check or gap repair, but come out to the raft-up anyway.
