Minisceongo Yacht Club will hold its next meeting on Friday, April 14, 2017 at 8 P.M. in the Clubhouse.

From Commodore Art Basley:

Well I guess there is a reason we wait to hear from a Ground Hog. March weather threw us a curve with an eighteen inch snow fall on the 14th. At some points during the storm it was coming down two to three inches an hour. But our members know what to do during these events and we have the equipment to do it. Skip Turk managed to get to the club during the tail end of the storm and with the white truck, plowed us out. This helped a great deal the next day to get a jump on cleaning up the walkways and moving the piles of snow with the backhoe. Anyway we were back in business quickly and the snow is now almost all gone. With such a mild

winter I guess Mother Nature was just showing us who is the boss.

But all this snow stuff didn't stop the work as John Kime, Harry Moser, Frank Covino and our members kept things moving at the ramp. A trench was dug for the utility connections from the old pits by the Travel Lift area for the finger 4 & 5 docks. Harry Moser and his crew framed out the utility area for

a concrete pad to be poured. The new above ground utility hot box will be installed there and include adequate connections for all the electrical, water and communications needed for future expansion. All the service lines were installed in the trench and it was filled, compacted, and graded off making it ready for use. The next step will be to place the concrete sections at the base of the ramp and form the rest of the area. Additional rock will be placed at the top of the existing bulkhead wall and the area graded off and finished.

The old gap closure dock used for many decades to keep the ice flow out of our



basin was finally decommissioned. Well that's a nice way of saying we cut it up and threw it in the dumpster. Peter Alfieri and Chris Durland led the saw brigade and made short order of the demolition. Through many bad icy winters it stayed afloat and did a great job keeping the ice flows out of our basin. It is now replaced with a floating concrete dock, figure that out.

Eric Vandenberg and his crew began the job of removing the many circulators and electrical cords from the dock systems. Guy Plassart and Joe Senackerib made sure the electrical meters are all working and opening season readings noted. And naturally Frank Covino and his crew where bouncing around the Club taking care of all the electrical needs.

By now I'm sure many of you are working on your boats. A couple of things to remember: secure your ladder, wear eye protection and a mask when scrapping or sanding and be sure to place tarps or plastic under your boat when working on the bottom. Police the area, ie clean up around your boat and unplug the electric before you leave for the day.

If your boat is blocking another boat you must be ready in April for launching. If you have a problem call me sooner rather than later.

We will be getting a dumpster for shrink wrap disposal. If you remove the shrink wrap before we have the dumpster in place, please secure it so that it doesn't blow around the Yard and into the beam path which will set off the alarm. Additionally you must remove the banding strap from the shrink wrap before you put it in the dumpster.

We have already started to launch boats. We launch on Saturdays and Wednesday mornings. Please call or email me to set up a date.

It's getting much closer to the start of the 2017 boating season. The Wednesday crew is busy with some chores around the club that would not got done any other way. The circulators are being removed. Perhaps that's the end of ice in the harbor for this season. We will have a meeting and pizza party on Saturday, May 6 at 5pm in the Clubhouse. Please bring an appy or dessert to share, and BYOB. Sorry we had to cancel the flea market, I'm sure you were all looking forward to cleaning out the sail locker, but there were 4 feet of snow drifted under the pavilion. It has been re-scheduled for Saturday, June 3 at 9am.

First episode: This month we start our trip down the Hudson River and begin an adventure in Long Island Sound. I was much younger and less experienced, so a trip of this magnitude involved much pre-planning especially on a 25foot sailboat. Once again the fearless crew was my favorite son Dan. Besides getting all the necessary equipment ready on the boat, we collected all the necessary charts and guidebooks. A brand new handheld GPS was purchased to help find our position on the paper charts. We checked the tide tables and current charts for the planned 2-week trip.

In a small sailboat you can't easily sail around Manhattan if the current is against you, even the trip down the Hudson can be excruciatingly slow against the current. We picked a weekend when the tides seemed favorable.

All the best plans can evaporate if the weather doesn't cooperate. We were approaching the Saturday departure date with some anxiety. The weather forecast called for late day rain and thunderstorms. We had to make a decision, follow our scheduled early morning departure with the outgoing tide or wait until the next day when the forecast was for heavy winds and rain again! We decided to take a chance, maybe the rain would hold off long enough to get around Manhattan and into the Sound. Leaving a little later than planned, we sailed against the current for a while before

MYC Gap Entrance, Channel Reminder:

Entrance buoys 1 & 2 are purposely staggered to offer a wider approach to our narrow channel. When entering, we will continue to utilize red buoy 2A as an indicator of the slight turn of the channel to starboard towards buoys 3 & 4 and beyond to the gap. Our channel depth is 7' at mean low water. <u>Always</u> sound your horn with a single <u>3 second blast</u> when entering or exiting the gap. Boats <u>entering</u> the gap from the channel <u>have right of way</u>.

Director's Report for March 7, 2017

A presentation on the Harbor committee's plans for * the coming year was made to the Executive Committee by Harbor Chairman John Kime.

⋇ The Board decided that for legal reasons each Chairman will be required at years end to prepare a committee report on the committee's accomplishments for the year and the members that helped with each project.

The Board is evaluating a change in the bylaws that ⋇ would require a member to attend a specific number of meetings in the previous twelve months to be eligible to vote.

The Board, after consulting our insurance agent, has * decided that fueling boats while on the stands in the yard will not be permitted. Also, it is illegal to fuel boats in the water except at a fueling station.

The Board continued to discuss a standardized * approach to becoming a probationary member.

The hoist, the type of hoist and the placement is still * under discussion.

* The MYC website is in the final stages of completion and is looking very good.

In the fall we will be adding to the boat storage contract * a section requiring information on current insurance for each boat.

The Board approved payment of MYC club insurances. *

A decision on the request by the Grounds chairman for * a non-budgeted leaf vacuum was postponed until the fall. A request for new straps for the travel lift will be * decided after inspection of the current straps is completed.
