What method to improve the basin side received many considerations. The decision was to present the options to the general membership for a final decision.
- For Every Kevin Silver reported that the FiOS system for phone and TV was operational in the Clubhouse and will be expanded.
- Director Tamagny presented the guidelines for use of the Opti sailboats for review.
- The Board approved the use of club facilities for Laser sailboat races in the month of April.
- The Long Term Planning Committee is now active and the Board awaits their presentation in the near future.
- Two new Associate member applications were read and approved for membership vote at the January meeting (Chris Raffa and Erik Vandenberg).
