Ask Cptn. Dick

From Dick Myers: Here is an interesting question for you, "How many times does the earth revolve on its axis in one year?"

Even with all the advances in marine navigation, all commercial ocean going vessels have someone on board that can find their position by the sun, planets and stars. Unlike the sun that apparently comes up to the same overhead position every 24 hours, the planets and stars are in a slightly different position every night. This is because the earth is on its yearly journey around the sun. In order to navigate using the stars and planets, a reference point has to be established. That yearly reference point is Aries. Aries is not a star, rather a point in the sky established once a year as being a line drawn from the center of the earth through the center of the sun at the northern vernal equinox.

If you answered 366 and one quarter days you are correct. 365 revolutions for the year, one revolution for the trip around the sun, and one quarter for leap year.

Cruising Destination of the Month: Boca Grande, Fl. on Gasparilla Island

Since it is too cold to think of cruising around here, I am dreaming of the warm waters and beautiful beaches of the gulf coast of Florida. All you Florida residents, take a cruise and think of us.

We chartered a Grand Banks 36 in Sarasota a few years back, and enjoyed some of the loveliest cruising grounds we have ever seen. The waters are turquoise blue and full of dolphins playing. The beaches are white and pink powdery sand, soft and warm. One of our stops was Boca Grande on Gasparilla Island, on the north side of the Boca Grande inlet to Charlotte Sound. I am sure Todd and Fran Cassetta (*Loan Survivor*) could tell you much more about the boating and fishing in this area. We chose to stay at Uncle Henry's Marina on the north end of the island. The approach at dusk was tricky because of the narrow but very well marked channel. We were greeted and helped into our slip by friendly staff and neighbors. The facilities are excellent and well protected. Since it is a couple of miles to town, we rented a golf cart, which is the standard mode of transportation on the Island, and explored the next day. There is a great Lighthouse Museum on the southern tip of the island, South Beach for a swim and its delicious waterfront restaurant. We also took a spin around the quiet town with shops, restaurants and lovely homes.

If you want to be close to town there are a couple of other marinas. To get a taste of old Florida, try Whidden's Marina with a homey feel and very reasonable fees. If you want the latest modern full service marina you might prefer Boca Grande Marina. Both are walking distance from town, but you might still like to rent a golf cart to explore this lovely quiet Island in the sun.
