Report for August from the Board of Directors

From Director Tony Schweiker for Senior Director Dave Tonneson

- Commodore Senackerib reported that he toured the MYC property regarding Minisceongo's insurance with Charles Medlicott who is attempting to provide the Club with insurance cost and coverage comparisons.
- Treasurer Romano will research reasons why MYC carries a Workman's Compensation policy.
- Replacing trees: the subject of planting replacement trees was discussed, and the Board decided the best time for this would be this upcoming fall.
- The reconfiguration of the Boatyard for 2012–13 is being planned by Committee Chairman Roger Wieland. He will present his layout to the Board of Directors shortly. Aggregate and stone purchase was approved for continued stabilization of the Yard.
- A request was received for the Power Squadron use of our boat ramp and dock to conduct a vessel safety and handling session for their members. Their request was approved.
- A ONE WAY DO NOT ENTER sign has been purchased and will be installed at the Dock 4 entrance road.
- Senior Director Tonneson reported that the new topographical survey maps have been received. A meeting will be scheduled with the engineer and members of our clubhouse committee to clarify future sites for a clubhouse.
- A decision was reached to form a search committee pertaining to the acquisition of a commercial yard trailer. The purpose will be to make the task of moving and storing of boats at Minisceongo more efficient, as well as solving the problem of more space for onland boat storage.

Cruising Destination of the month:

Donovan's Shady Harbor Marina

We took a long weekend trip with family up the Hudson. We have often stayed in Catskill, but this year we needed to make other plans. We looked on the Active Captain website for reviews, and found that Shady Harbor has recently changed hands, and has been investing seriously in upgrading their facility. We were put on the end of their new floating dock with upgraded electric and water, new pool and picnic area, clean and renovated bath house, convenience/ship store and restaurant. Although there is no commercial town center within walking distance, you can take a pleasant walk through residential streets with old Victorian houses and views of the river.

We were met by their dock hand Janson, who knew his job and was very friendly and welcoming. Soon we were greeted by the new owner Brian Donovan, who welcomed us warmly.

This is a very friendly marina with a lot of weekend activity. We put in our kayak, and saw many others on kayaks, jet skis, small and large boats passing the marina. The Hudson is narrow there, with an island opposite the marina. Because of this, most boaters really do slow down and observe the NO WAKE zone. We were not bothered by heavy wakes at all. This is a good stopping spot on the way north to the canals and Lake Champlain. More important, it is a great destination—at trawler speed, an overnight stop in Kingston splits the distance nicely.
