#### Directors Report for November, 2019

- De-Ice Committee Chairman Erik Vandenburg reported on the status of the committee staff, equipment and plans for winterizing the basin.
- Policy review Members must winter store their boats at MYC unless there are special circumstances or trailer boats taken home.
- The board reviewed a Bylaws Proposal presented by director Basley, chair of the committee. The board approved this and it will be brought up in New Business.
- Director Hudson is getting 2020 yard stickers and will continue to monitor dry sail and trailered boats.
- The board made a decision to move forward on a time capsule and a special dedication ceremony for the new clubhouse
- The Auxiliary has offered to purchase the time capsule and fund a portion of the New Club House furniture.
- Vice Commodore Vicidomini will be updating our Five Year Plan. Projects being considered include shoring up the gabions along docks 5, 1/3, new roof and refurbishment of the pavilion, bathrooms in the Snack Shack as well as a pool. A questionnaire requesting input from the membership is being looked into.
