Our Board members have taken extensive steps and many hours of work to make sure we meet our insurance carriers requirements so please do not take this lightly. Do the right thing to protect your club.

Security Committee

The Access Control System is activated on all the basin gates and yard.

Please contact Peter Alfieri if you need to have the yard beam turned off while you're commissioning your boat in storage.

Keep all debris out of the yard beams as you work on your boat. I can be reached at 845 987 2972 Spring activities in the boat yard are increasing as the weather gets a little nicer. We are launching boats on Saturdays and Wednesdays. Any other day will be by special request only. So pick a launch date and send an email or text to Roger Wieland, or me with your preferred date.

Please mark your boat with the location to be used for the travel lift slings. Have fenders and docklines ready before you leave the launch pit. Take the heads for your stands and the chains home for the summer.

- If you are scraping or sanding your boat bottom you must use a tarp or ground cloth.
- * When you are painting the boat bottom you must use a tarp or ground cloth.
- * When your boat has been launched be sure to clean up your area, do not leave garbage or paint brushes, rollers or trays.

* A dumpster has been provided in the yard for your shrink wrap. Shrink wrap is not to be thrown into the regular club dumpsters.

As always, Each time you visit your boat:

- * Check your jack stands, they could move in the rain and strong winds.
- * Secure your ladder when getting on or off your boat.
- * If you plug into the electric to charge your batteries be sure you unplug before you leave the Yard.
- * Be sure your cover is secure and not blowing into the security beam path.
- * When you remove your shrink wrap secure it so it won't blow into the security beam path.
