- * Probationary nominations were approved for reading at the general meeting on the 13th of September.
- * Disposal of abandoned boats in the yard was discussed, with possible solutions.

- * Verizon will install new fiber optic lines to the new clubhouse. We will still be billed for both services. We will keep the internet and turn off the TV service in the old clubhouse for the winter.
