Meter readings: The Treasurer was instructed to create a document to be available to the membership so that they may monitor their own electric use readings if they so choose. However, be it known to all that the Club will bill the individual members based on their slip contractual tenancy, which begins on May 1 and ends on October 31. In the event of a discrepancy in the electric usage the Board agreed to rule in favor of the document compiled by the member with detailed numerical proof of kilowatt usage.

**In-water storage review:** The Board agreed that inwater stored boats should plug into the pedestal electricity. A separate in-water storage contract will be compiled in the future.

Moorings are available with launch service/security 24 hours a day. Call the launch operator, and he will meet you and direct you to a mooring ball. The clubhouse is elegant and includes a lounge, restaurant (open weekends), bar, restrooms, indoor and outdoor seating. The members are friendly and enjoy guests.

Walk one block from the water to City Island Avenue, the main North/South street. There are many restaurants up and down the avenue, especially seafood and Italian style.
