Remember after you are launched to take your tops from your stands and chains home for the summer. If your top has been damaged, please repair or replace before hauling day in the fall. Shrink wrap should be thrown away in the "shrink wrap only" dumpster in the yard.

We will be moving stands around in the yard to make room for trailers and dry sailed boats.

Please do not chain/lock your stands together or we will use our universal key to remove the chain.

If you store a trailer in the yard for the summer, you will need a sticker to identify the owner. It would also help if your name is on the trailer. MYC stickers can be obtained by contacting Andy Hudson.
