If you have not submitted your Winter Storage form, please do so to insure a space for your boat in the Yard. If you need a form you can pick one up in the Club House or get it on the MYC web site. Please mail it to my home: 92 N. Island Avenue, Ramsey, NJ 07446 or email it to me.

Additionally check your jack stands before your hauling date. Check the wooden tops and replace if broken and lubricate the adjustment handle. It makes it a lot easier for the Yard Committee to set your boat up when we are not dealing with rusted stands that are difficult to adjust.

Please note that this year we are finding barnacles on the running gear i.e. shafts, props and trim tabs. We will power wash your boat, however, the barnacles are your responsibility. Therefore I urge you to bring help and scrapers when we haul your boat.

If you are planning to remove your mast please contact me.

The haul out schedule will be posted in the Club House, the Snack Shack and the MYC web site by October 1, 2018.
