Yard Committee

From Chairman Don Rubin

I hope you and your family are well and sheltering-in-place! The boatyard committee has been launching boats. Contact Roger Wieland to schedule a launch date. We are working on a reduced schedule at this time. We are also trying to reduce the number of people involved in the launching process to maintain social distancing.

We are asking members if they come to the club to work on their boat and remove the shrink wrap, to please remember to put the shrink wrap in the dumpster located in the boatyard with the SHRINKWRAP sign. Shrinkwrap should not be put in contractor's dumpster or the other dumpsters around the club. Better yet, you could bring it home for local disposal. Also don't just throw the shrink wrap on the ground or under a boat for the yard committee to put in the dumpster. Please do not leave your boat plugged into electric if you are not with your boat.

We ask that members bottom painting their boat use a tarp or ground cloth to prevent paint spills on the ground. If members change their engine oil or other fluids take care to prevent spills and dispose of the fluids in the proper containers in Jerry's.

If there are still pandemic concerns later in the season, the boatyard committee would like to begin hauling boats starting in the end of September and beginning of October since we plan on using only one travel lift at that time to reduce the number of boatyard crew involved in hauling and blocking. Continued from May Ship-to-Shore ..Spending two days at Pilots Point was excellent.

It was decided our next destination would be Milford CT. Wind forecasted to be light from the Northwest. A 27 mile distance in light winds can be challenging and the sailors thought it best to get an early start to catch the flood tide with a plan to motor when wind and current aren't favorable. "Varka", "Silver Lining", "Janie Rose" and "SeaClusion" planned to depart around 9:30AM. Chris, aboard "Marianne" wanted to sleep late

and planned to leave around 11:00.

Milford Landing is a small municipal marina and is right smack on the edge of town and fun to walk around. Last year Don Rubin decided to surprise us by driving out to Milford and joined us in a Barbeque. This is the first time he'll be sailing into Milford. As such it was decreed that Don will be buying ice cream for the

whole group at Scoops (I did say this was an imaginary cruise!:)) which is located right on the marina property. For days the Schoenlank/ Deaney's aboard "West Wind" talked about how Milford Yacht Club had the very best Lobster Rolls, so the next day we took a long walk to the yacht club, located near the mouth of the harbor. After waiting 30 minutes for a table we savored every bite and enjoyed the view of the inlet.

We had two more long days to get home so Friday morning we all left early for the 40 mile run to Port Washington. The wind shifted to the south and was forecasted to be around 15 kts. picking up to 20kts early afternoon. The Tamagny's aboard "Dream Chaser, the Schoenlank/Deaney's Aboard "West Wind", and the Rubin's aboard "Lazy Susan" left early bucking the current

The forecast for Saturday and Sunday were awful. Wind and rain

forecasted for both days which makes the run home miserable and potentially unsafe. While some folks needed to be back at work it's safety first, so we delayed our return until Monday

Everyone arrived back to MYC by 3:30 PM. Another successful boating adventure!

I hope you enjoyed our imaginary cruise. As we navigate through troubled COVID-19 waters think about taking a one or two week cruise this summer. Marinas and Clubs are open in NY. Transient rates for slips and dockage will most likely be at reduced rates. Wishing all our members calm seas and tranquility aboard our boats.

Board of Directors Report - May, 2020 From Senior Director Kevin Silver

- * General meeting on May 8th will be cancelled due to large gathering restrictions during the pandemic. Approval to pay bills will be requested of regular members by email.
- * C Vicidomini proposed the Clubhouse remained closed, the bath trailer open, the Snack Shack will only be open during launch days for the crew to rest, less than 5 at a time, and then re-locked. The Dock picnic areas will be open with social distancing, and the grills have been installed and are ready.
- * A request by a member to dry sail a jet ski. The board reviewed and confirmed MYC bylaws prohibit this type of watercraft as the only member vessel
- * The BOD extended the May 1st deadline for winter guests to remove boats from the yard until June 15th after which they will be charged a late fee of \$20/day
- * C Vicidomini asked for an official policy addressing issues when a boat is sold. D Basley will follow up.

- * Walter Moser graciously bequeathed a large sum of funds to the club in his will. The board is investigating using these funds to serve as a basis for the formation of an endowment in Moe's name. This endowment may serve as a vehicle for other members wishing to utilize in their estate planning.
- * C Vicidomini proposed a short (15 min?) presentation of the flags with no picnic for Opening Day Ceremony:. Other 2020 social events to be decided at the June meeting
- * VC Galetta reports the venue for the Change of Watch is requiring a 50% deposit immediately to hold the date. Due to COVID-19 concerns it was decided we may not have enough people to attend to make the 125 person minimum. VC Galetta will cancel reservation. An alternative would be to hold a smaller event in the new clubhouse.


