Report for May from the **Board of Directors**

From Senior Director Roger Wieland

- Commodore Gutierrez informed the Board that the billing for the bulkhead steel does not qualify as a capital expense. Therefore we must pay the sales tax of \$4,659.00
- The Executive Committee discussed several candidates for Probationary status and approved three, to be forwarded to Membership for the interview process.
- Vice Commodore Tamagny discussed his concerns about how to proceed with the Dock 5 bulkhead project after the first phase of installing the steel is complete. He suggested we put a plan together to discuss next month.
- The Board approved three new members to be voted on at the general membership meeting.
- Director Martin discussed setting up new fire stations in the Yard because the wooden platforms on the old ones have deteriorated. Director Tonneson suggested using a steel wheel as a base, with an upright metal stanchion. Director Martin will follow-up.
- Director Schweiker made a recommendation to bill temporary summer guests in our Yard, a prorated rate based on the normal guest per ft. rate. The Board approved his recommendation.
