Directors Report July, 2019

Greetings to all and welcome to summer. By now you all are in full swing and many of us are just dodging the extreme heat. Some of our weekends have been intolerable but I am confident better days are yet to come.

I would like to first to make some very important reminders. MYC has guidelines that MUST be followed. In addition to stating them in this S to S, I will be posting them on the gate of each dock as well as speaking with each dock captain. The primary reason for these guidelines are related to safety and will be strictly enforced. If not followed, the BOD will take action for repeat offenders.

First and foremost is vehicle speed on club grounds. All MUST maintain a slow speed. We have young children running around and we must be very watchful of them. Second, you are raising a lot of dust. This is causing the boats on dock 4 to be covered in dust. We also have members either trying to BBQ or eat in the picnic areas who don't enjoy eating the grit. This is a simple courtesy to your fellow members.

This next Rule is not just an MYC rule but a coast guard rule as well. You MUST sound a coast guard approved horn when approaching the gap either from the basin or the river. This required signal should be sounded

not more than 100 or 200 feet from the gap. Again, this is a REQUIRED RULE. Also, children 12 and under MUST wear life jackets when on the docks ... common sense.

Parking: You are to park your vehicles in the designated areas. When going to docks 5 or 6 you can stop at the gate to

load or unload only, then you MUST park off the peninsulas. This will allow emergency vehicles access should the need arrive. It's also inconsiderate as it blocks the river view to boaters. Again, a common courtesy to your fellow members. There is one exception, "live aboard" can park on the peninsula on weekdays only.
