Shady Harbor Marina

This month's favorite harbor is presented by long-time members *Miriam and Marvin Raber* on dock 3. Their yacht of choice is a Tolleycraft, beautifully maintain vessel. They do a most of their cruising on the Hudson River.

Donovan's Shady Harbor Marina is located in New Baltimore approximately 100 miles from Minisceongo Yacht Club. It is located on a narrow stretch of the Hudson River that is designated a No Wake Zone. New Baltimore is a small community that is reported to be too far to walk from the marina, (editor's note- what is too far to walk, uphill both ways?) The marina often has a complementary car available for a 2 hour excursion.

The fuel dock and most slips are easy in, easy out, but caution is necessary while maneuvering on a windy day. The marina has nice sturdy docks, a small swimming pool and a well equipped picnic area for grilling. You can also purchase fresh meat, poultry, ice cream and snacks and some clothing in the ship's store. A good restaurant on the premises serves lunch and dinner.

Cruising Fleet Special Report

From Marvin and Miriam Raber:

As an adjunct to the Cruise Fleet trip to Annapolis, Miriam and Marv Raber and Janice and Joe Senackerib toured the U.S. Naval Surface Warfare Center, Carderock Facility, located in Carderock, Maryland, a neighborhood in Montgomery County along the

<u>Potomac River</u>, just west of <u>Bethesda</u>.

Carderock is the full-spectrum research and development, test and evaluation, engineering and fleet support organization for the Navy's ships, submarines, military watercraft, and unmanned vehicles. Carderock specializes in ship design and Integration; environmental quality systems;

hull forms and propulsors; structures and materials; and other ships systems.

The tour describes the 100 year history of the Carderock Division and includes visits to various large testing facilities, many of which are unique, including the David Taylor Model Basin, Circulating

Water Channel, Rotating Arm, and the Maneuvering and Seakeeping Basin. In addition, we saw the model shop where precise scale models of Navy ships and submarines, some as long as 40 feet, are constructed for testing in the basins. The model shop fabricates

some model components using 3-D printing.

The facilities are very impressive for their size, with one pool being about 3200 feet long. Large platforms that run on tracks tow models in the pools at speeds as high as 50 knots, and hold the data gathering equipment. A variety of wave conditions can be produced in the pools. We did not see any

actual testing; they probably do not test during tours for reasons of safety and confidentiality.

The facility also does work for commercial ship and boat developers who pay for this service. They have done work for America's Cup competitors.
