By now all members should be receiving the general meeting minutes via the MYC email member distribution list. If not, please give Andy Hudson your email address. Those who have received the minutes know that the committee report and recommendations were distributed by the New Club House Committee at the end of the March general meeting for contemplation and review by the membership. The proposed design and floor plan continue to be on view in the clubhouse.

The house discussion will be broken up into two parts. Part one, starting with April's meeting, will focus on fiscal issues relative to construction costs. Treasurer Romano will present a financial plan that will detail the size of the mortgage we can afford, allocation of a building fund and anticipated start dates based upon the overall cost of the project. Members will be asked to think about the funding plan for a month or so and then vote to accept or reject this plan.

Once a financial plan is accepted by the members, we will then be ready to address the house design. We need to consider our goals and vision for our club. This is the time where all members need to weigh in on specific concerns that you feel are important. For example, whether one feels the house is too small, too big, or just right, be prepared to voice your opinion. This will be the critical decision point of the particular house we may build. These decisions will dictate the future of our club and set a number of things in motion.

Senior Director Ed Gutierrez presented a motion, which was passed by the membership, to purchase a bath/shower trailer for use by the club. Thanks to the great efforts of Ed and Chris Vicidomini along with the support and guidance of Plumbing Chairman Harry Moser and Rear Commodore Art Basely, we now will have ample bathroom facilities at the club. As this trailer is portable, it can be conveniently moved to the pavilion during large club functions.

Last but certainly not least, only 30 days to go 'till boating season!

Yard Committee Report

By now I'm sure many of you are working on your boats. A couple of things to remember: secure your ladder, wear eye protection and a mask when scrapping or sanding and be sure to place tarps or plastic under your boat when working on the bottom. Police the area around your boat before you leave for the day. Clean up and unplug you boat before you leave.

If your boat is blocking another boat you must be ready in April for launching. If you have a problem call me sooner rather than later.

If your boat is shrink wrapped it is your responsibility to dispose of it...Take it home. Do not put it in the Club's dumpsters.


