Director's Report for June 2016

From Director Bob Tamagny:

Harbor Committee Chairman John Kime, * Security Committee Chairman Peter Alfieri and Yard Committee Chairman Roger Wieland were all present to give reports. John reported on the possibility of moving the launch ramp and reasons for doing so. The project would require approximately 170 linear feet of stone at \$75 per foot, as opposed to using steel at \$1200 per foot. John and Roger spoke of the need to move and land store the existing floating dock now behind dock 5. Different land locations were reviewed to accommodate this. Peter reported on installation of a new security system. This update would include cameras and an upgrade of our internal bandwidth capability. Peter distributed information and pricing as well as how we could do this in stages. This upgrade will be re-examined in the future.

* John Kime researched a solution to kill and control the growth of weeds in our basin. The club will seek a DEC application, then a liquid herbicide will be sprayed on the weeds. This all will be based on the DEC approval. A contract with Anchor Fence has been approved for the installation of a new fence along the roadway to Dock 6. This will allow for more parking along that roadway.

* Rear Commodore Brienza gave a report on our security breach that occurred on Opening Day. Rich will review this with Membership.

* Treasurer Jim Hawthorne gave his report on the Club's finances and on our aging late payments. The Club will be looking to place a judgement and lien on two boats that are being stored on our grounds.

* Rear Commodore Brienza gave an in-depth report on our 75th Opening Day Celebration. The report included plans to rebury our time capsule on our Opening Day celebration 2017.

* Shrink wrap disposal. The dumpster will be removed at the end of this month.

* Memorial Plaque. A repair or replacement, depending on cost, of our plaque will be done so the plaque can be replaced out by the gazebo.

Electrical and Maintenance From Chairman Frank Covino

We are required by the Stony Point Fire Department to install CO2 sensors in the clubhouse, snack shack, laundry room and portable bathrooms. This work will be completed by the end of June.

These last 30 years I have enjoyed talking with her about our time in Saddle River and about our friends at MYC. And yes, Michaely, I still love you! Sorry


Roger - I knew her first. Peace be with you my friend.
