Cruising Fleet From Chairman Don Rubin

At the beginning of October residents on the east coast of the U.S. watched anxiously to see where the strongest storm in many years would come ashore. The storm originated off the coast of Africa and developed into a tropical storm in the Caribbean at the end of September. Matthew became a hurricane on September 29, ultimately achieving Category 5 intensity the following day. Travelling over land in the western Caribbean weakened the storm to a Category 3. Matthew gathered strength to become a Category 4 storm again as it moved away from Cuba and toward the Bahamas. The storm then paralleled the coast of the southeastern United States while remaining just offshore before making its fourth and final landfall just south of Myrtle Beach South Carolina.

The timing of Hurricane Matthew coincided with the start of the annual migration south for many northeast U.S. boaters. Online sailing sites and ICW sites began

through much of the day when the storm went through. A buddy living on Hilton Head sent an email saying one local marina was destroyed, while other facilities were barely damaged.

The Dismal Swamp canal in Virginia/North Carolina closed by the US Army Corps of Engineers due to high water. The USACE reports at the North Carolina Welcome Center, that "The water level is continuing to drop and we are hopeful that the Canal will be reopening soon. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is working hard to remove trees/debris along the Canal, especially between the Deep Creek Lock and the Dismal Swamp Welcome Center. The Elizabeth returns today to start clearing more than 60 trees along See photo above:

We experienced heavy wind and rain for three days, but were protected from the surge by the lock. Residents along the canal invited all of the boaters to come to their houses if things got rough. I surely hope they did not sustain too much flood damage. - Keira)
