# Report for February from the Board of Directors

Finger Captains list of responsibilities: Commodore Tamagny assigned the task of designing an outline of responsibilities to be carried out by the appointed Finger Captains to Vice Commodore Senackerib and Rear Commodore Ferraro. The Vice and Rear Commodores will report on the assignment at the March Directors' meeting.

**Tell Tale Publications:** Commodore Tamagny is considering the idea of implementing a plan to have the MYC *Ship to Shore* publication available to affiliate Yacht Clubs, on a reciprocity basis, (Nyack for example) to exchange items of mutual concern to clubs on the river.

**North Jersey Concert Band:** The North Jersey Concert band requested permission to perform once again at MYC on July 9, 2011. A motion was made to approve the request by Director Schweiker. The motion was seconded and approved by voice vote.

Northport Yacht Club welcomes MYC members as reciprocal visitors. They have moorings available with launch service to their beautiful club facility. You are welcome to swim in their dockside pool, eat at the snack bar by the pool, pub menu on the deck or in the bar, or on the weekends in the formal dining room (appropriate attire required). Comfortable restrooms and showers are near the pool.
