Ask Cptn Dick

From Dick Myers: I'm sure most of you have heard the expression, "We are really flying now." Believe it or not, except for actually flying or jumping off a tall building, which I really don't recommend, the closest you would come to a truism with that remark would be sailing. A bottle screw is just another term for turn screw or turnbuckle. They are the adjustments that you find on a sailboat that connect the cables from the mast to the deck. An interesting use for these turnbuckles would be to shape the mast to the sail. You may notice that some boats in our club actually have a backwards bend to the mast. Sail making is a real art. If you were to consider how a sail works, it's not just something to catch the wind and propel the boat forward. A lot of times the sail is not catching the wind. It's actually cutting through the wind and acting as an air foil. On an airplane wing, the top part of the wing is a longer distance than the bottom part of the wing. In other words, an airfoil creates a longer path on the top of the wing for the air to flow over creating a longer distance for the air to travel. When this happens, a vacuum is created. On an airplane, this is what lifts the plane into the air. On a sailboat, when you are sailing

into the wind, the shape of the sail forms an airfoil and the same principle applies. A vacuum at the head of the sail pulls the boat sideways and forward. Hence to say you are really flying now is a truism when you are sailing except you are flying sideways over the water.

Malcolm Coyle wants to know what a Jacob's ladder is. Wow, I don't see how this pertains to boating, but any good electrical engineer will tell you that a Jacob's ladder is two wires in a form of a V with a lot of electrical power potential between them. What will happen is that at the base of the V an arc will be created, and this arc will travel upwards to the top of the V and then the whole process will start over again at the base of the V. Sort of like someone telling the same story over and over again, fascinating at first, but then very boring. Yea I know, something like my articles.
