Hello all:

It's January. As I look at my outdoor thermometer, it reads 7 degrees. It's snowing, and the wind is blowing with gusts of 25. For you lovers of the sound, it's well over 30 at Eatons Neck. Aren't you glad your boat is safely up the Hudson, blocked with the care of our yard committee? It is a good idea to check your stands though, as sometimes they sink a bit with the freeze thaw cycles we've been having.

A big thanks goes to the ice committee for checking the ice buildup every day during this cold weather. It's not an easy thing going out on the docks and fixing what doesn't work.

Most of you don't remember the winter of 1994. We broke a foot of rotten ice at the end of March that year. That was the last time that Croton was sailed by iceboats.

All of the piles on dock 1 needed to be straightened. Many needed to be reset on the other docks with the old pile driver. There were docks broken in two. It was an incredible amount of work to get the harbor ready for boats that year. That's the winter we have now. Thankfully, our harbor is protected from the ice flows coming down the river, and we have a new dock system. We have

a much better ice system. We may have a few things to fix, but nothing like back then. I'm very thankful to those who worked so tirelessly to re-vitalize our dock system.

July 12-25 and Regatta July 26 - \$35/Sailor Must swim, have a life jacket and like to have FUN!!!!!!


Cruising Fleet News

Predicted Log Competition

A Predicted log competition is a great way to get to know your boat and to develop your navigational skills. Contestants are given a course that has a start and finish line, with several buoys or checkpoints in between. The skipper needs to predict how long it will take the boat to travel to each check point and the finish line. The boat that is closest to their predicted time is the winner.

Sounds easy... Drive up to the buoy, wait until the time you predicted and then pass the checkpoint. Well, the thing that makes it a challenge is that the skipper can't have a clock, GPS, auto pilot or speedometer. Your tools consist of

a compass, a tachometer, a chart, tide/current predictions and the weather report. Only the contest's official observer on board has access to a time piece and marks the exact time the boat passes each marker.

The following is an excerpt from the United States Power Squadrons (USPS) Predicted Log Guide:

"Predicted log contests allow a skipper to sharpen piloting, speed control, and boat-handling skills. These competitions provide opportunities for a skipper to learn about the contest boat and to learn how it performs under various conditions. Predicted log contests are tests of piloting, navigation, and boat de-

pendability, not tests of speed. Key factors to success are careful piloting, accurate determination of boat speed, and application of currents, sea conditions, and turning times."
